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Re : **Your Client Adrian Campbell**

We act for Mr. Jamie McIntyre in Indonesia. Our client has advised us that there appears to be an effort underway to commence proceedings against him in the Australian Federal Court by Adrian Campbell, who we understand is your client.

To be clear, **our client in no way accepts nor submits to the jurisdiction of the Australian Federal Court in the proceedings apparently commenced by Adrian Campbell.**

We understand that Mr. Campbell's claim is based on statements allegedly published by Mr. McIntyre on-line in Mr. McIntyre's capacity as the Commissioner of an Indonesian foreign investment development company (PT. Marina Bay Investments or "MBI"), and/or in his capacity as the Director in a second Indonesian foreign investment Company (PT Bali Real Estate Investments or "BRIE"). Those alleged statements, we understand, are also alleged by Mr. Campbell to be defamatory.

In relation to MBI, both Mr McIntyre and Mr Campbell hold indirect ownership interests through entities under their respective control, and there has been a longstanding and complex dispute concerning the management and application of MBI funds. Those matters are also currently under investigation by the Australian Federal Police, at the instigation of our client.

We are instructed that your client has also in the past threatened to commence similar spurious defamation proceedings against an Australian investor who lodged a genuine fraud complaint against your client with both the police in Bali, Indonesia and the Australian Federal Police, as well as having made similar threats to other individuals associated with Mr. McIntyre and his business. Indeed, we are advised that Mr. Campbell has at one time or another threatened legal proceedings against almost everyone associated with Mr. McIntyre, MBI or BRIE who does not accept Mr. Campbell's spurious and ill-conceived allegations against our client

In relation to the defamation proceedings recently commenced by your client in Australia, we note as follows :

1. Jamie McIntyre is a lawful temporary resident in Indonesia and not normally resident in Australia.
2. We also understand that Adrian Campbell, who is a person of interest in the above noted Australian Federal Police investigation, resides in Thailand and is not normally resident in Australia.
3. To the best of our client's knowledge, no effort whatsoever has been made by Mr. Campbell to serve Mr. McIntyre with an originating process in a manner that complies with the service requirements under the laws of Indonesia. In that regard, Mr. McIntyre's address and place of work in Indonesia are very well known to your client.
4. All the matters referred to by both Mr. Campbell and allegedly by Mr. McIntyre on-line, relate to their respective involvement in a property development undertaken by MBI here Indonesia. Moreover, we are instructed that any statements made by our client about your client were not made while our client was in Australia.
5. Mr. Campbell has already commenced civil defamation proceeding against Mr. McIntyre here in Indonesia in the Denpasar District Court listed as civil case 469/Pdt.G/2026/PN.Dps (copy enclosed) and we take the view therefore that commencing parallel proceedings in Australia based on the same cause of action is an abuse of process. Moreover, the simple fact is that your client has already made his choice of forum by commencing proceedings in Indonesia, a choice which makes Australia a clearly inappropriate forum to adjudicate the same cause of action that is already before the courts in Indonesia.

6. Your client has himself published numerous online statements concerning our client which are demonstrably false and defamatory, including statements disseminated through WhatsApp communication forums, Indonesian media publications, and publicly accessible websites.
7. Without knowing the specifics of what your client alleges were defamatory statements made by our client, we note that the majority of comments attributed to our client were made in his capacity as a company officer and in response to false statements made by Mr Campbell.
8. We are also instructed that Adrian Campbell has allegedly engaged in a protracted course of conduct targeting Jamie McIntyre and his business interests, by means which are the subject of legal proceedings here in Indonesia, including:
 - a) repeatedly interfering in the contractual relations of both MBI and BRIE noted by unlawful means;
 - b) failing to account for investor funds solicited and received in connection with an MBI property development without authority by your client or by companies controlled by him;
 - c) misrepresenting the resources and experience of what your client has at all times referred to as Kinnara Asia, a group of shell companies controlled by your client, in a manner which has resulted in substantial losses to our client;
 - d) making false police and other official complaints in Indonesia against Mr. McIntyre;
 - e) trespass;
 - f) fraud; and
 - g) entering into a civil conspiracy with the former Indonesian director of both MBI and BRIE, and various third parties associated with the above noted companies, which has resulted in substantial losses as well as missing funds, the unlawful disclosure of confidential company information/documents, and unlawful contracts being made with third parties in an attempt to make Jamie McIntyre/MBI and/or BRIE liable for Mr. Campbell's own malfeasance.
9. In the circumstances, we maintain that Australia is clearly an inappropriate forum for these proceedings and assume that Mr. Campbell has been less that

forthright with his legal representatives and the court in applying for leave to serve the originating process outside of Australia.

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
10. Moreover, even if the court is inclined to permit the originating process to be served in Indonesia, we take the position that there is no basis for granting an order for substitute service of the originating process in this matter, since it appears that no effort whatsoever has been made to affect service in a manner that complies with the legal requirements for effective service under Indonesian law.
11. Further, please take note that should your client persist with trying to commence defamation proceedings against our client in any Australian court without properly serving our client personally with any originating process, our client will seek to have such proceedings struck out on various grounds, including abuse of process, improper service, and inconvenience of forum.
12. Should you client nevertheless somehow succeed after making proper disclosure to the court in getting leave both to serve the originating process outside of Australia and to do so by any form of substitute service, we also understand that our client will seek an order that your client, as a non-resident plaintiff, post security for costs in amount sufficient to compensate our client for all legal costs incurred by him in defeating this spurious claim.
13. Finally, we hereby request that you place a copy of this letter before the court at the first available moment and ensure that it is drawn to the presiding Justice's attention in the event your client should elect to proceed despite the above noted facts.


